Ordered that Thomas J. Wren, Esq. Wren Jr. ~~and~~ Micajah B. Cole and Robert F. Parker or any two of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise, all the goods or chattels of Eliza F. Wren dec'd that may be produced to them and make due return of the same.

The commissioners appointed to sell the old jail of this County this day made their report which is ordered to be filed of record - and it is ordered that the Sheriff of Southampton County collect of Geo. F. W. Newson the sum of twenty dollars the amount of the sale of the said old - jail.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent money in his hands not otherwise appropriated pay to the Editors of the Southern Argus the sum of five dollars and fifty cents for publishing order of Court &c.

On the motion of Philip J. Black who is bound in this Court as security of Richard Barr, as guardian of Mary Barr: the Court doth order the said Richard Barr to be summoned here to the first day of the next term to show cause if any he can why he should not be required to give a new bond with security conditioned according to Law.

Arthur A. Drewry who has been formerly appointed a Constable of this County, this day appears in Court, and gave bond and security and took the several oaths prescribed by Law - which bond is ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Levi C. Waller be appointed lawyer or of the road in the room of James M. Wren deceased and that the usual Laws do work thereon.
