Upon the petition of Simey Boyman a descendant of a female of the Potowomac tribe of Indians. This day this cause came again to be heard on the papers formerly read together with the report of the Commissioners made at the last term of this Court, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court upon mature consideration doth adopt and confirm the said report and order that the said Simey Boyman hold the land in the said report mentioned as his individual and absolute property, in full discharge of all her interest and claim in the estate here in trust for the benefit of the said tribe of Indians. The Court being of opinion that the said Simey Boyman is a person of good moral character, and is not likely to become chargeable to any part of the Commonwealth.
