This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read together with the report of the Commissioner made at the last term of this Court, to which report no exceptions having been filed, was argued by Counsel: On consideration whereof the Court approving and confirming said report, doth adjudge, order and decree that the same be held firm and stable and binding between all the parties forever, and that the costs of this suit be proportionably borne by all the parties.

On the motion of James St. Mangram Guardian of Marthe Ann Wren, Mary J. Wren, Andrew J. Wren, and Edward M. Wren, he is allowed to expend the sum of fifty dollars of the principal of each of his said wards estate for their support &c.

On the motion of Robt. S. Jones Guardian of Sarah I. Anderson, he is allowed to expend the sum of fifty dollars of the principal of his said ward's estate for her support &c.

On the motion of Wiley Artis, free negro, he is exempt from the payment of all taxes & levies, he being old & infirm.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County out of any contingent money in his hands not otherwise appropriated, pay to Thos. Biester thirty dollars for repairing the old Pond Bridge.

Ordered that Thos. J. Wren be appointed a prothonotary in pursuant No. 18. in the room of James Wren deceased.

The Court with advice Wm. St. Summerville guardian to Wiley & Ann Eliza Britt orphans of Willis Britt dec'd. whom upon he gave bond and security according to Law.

On the motion of Sally Britt ordered that Wm. St. Summerville Guardian of Wiley & Ann Eliza Britt pay to her her account of \$73.00 or so much thereof as he has found in his hands belonging to his said wards.

For reasons appearing to the Court. It is ordered that the Overseers of the poor of this County, as bind Henry son of Joe Roberts free negro, to Thomas R. Sutton according to Law. and the Court consider that one hundred dollars will be the value of the services of the apprentice in the art, trade or business which he is to be taught for the whole term for which he is
