Jesse Crocker and Henry Crocker free men of colour who stand charged
with a felony by them committed in this County and within the
jurisdiction of this Court in this that they did on or about the night
of the 6th day of May 1852 in said County feloniously break
and enter a certain Store House the property of Mills B. Sewell
and not adjoining to or occupied with the dwelling House of the
said Mills B. Sewell with intent the goods and chattels of the
said Mills B. Sewell in the said Store House then and there
to steal and that day they the said Jesse Crocker & Henry Crocker
summed silver & gold coins together with sundry Bank notes of the
value of the value of three hundred & fifteen dollars of
the goods and chattels and silver & gold coins and Bank notes
of the said Mills B. Sewell in the said Store House did
feloniously steal, take and carry away, was this day set
to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County and being
arraigned, pleaded not guilty, and the Court having heard the
evidence are unanimously of opinion that the said Jesse Crocker &
Henry Crocker are guilty of the offence with which they stand
charged: Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said
Jesse Crocker & Henry be imprisoned each in the penitentiary of
this Commonwealth for the term of five years each. Therein
to be kept and treated as the Law directs. And it is ordered that
the Sheriff of this County shall as soon as may be convenient
after the adjournment of this Court, remove and securely
convey the said Jesse Crocker & Henry Crocker from the jail
