

It appears to the Court from the returns of the Commissioners and officers conducting the same that at an election held in this County on the second Friday in October 1852, according to Law, to supply certain vacancies: Warren Edwards was elected overseer of the Poor in the place of William Edwards who failed to qualify in district No. 4., James E. Jones overseer of the Poor in the place of Drewing Bond who failed to qualify in district No. 7, Amington Dailmer and Jonathan Dailmer overseers of the Poor in the place of Matthew Wells deceased and Alfred Richs who failed to qualify.

William Brown a Justice of the Peace of this County this day returned a certificate of the qualification of Amington Dailmer as overseer of the Poor according to Law, in district No. 5 of this County.

Warren Edwards, this day appeared in Court and qualified according to Law overseer of the Poor in district No. 4 of this County, James E. Jones qualified according to Law overseer of the Poor in district No. 7 of this County, and Jonathan Dailmer qualified according to Law overseer of the Poor in district No. 5 of this County.

A vacancy existing in district No. 1 by reason of John A. Dison failing to qualify as overseer of the Poor, and the writ of election ordered at the last term of this Court to supply said vacancy not having been complied with, It is ordered that another writ of election be issued directed to Howell Harris, James E. Peters & Joseph M. Blunt Commissioners and John Williams conductor of the election to hold an election on Tuesday the second day of November 1852, to supply said vacancy.

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge across Cypress Swamp near J. D. Harris this day made their report

On the Petition of Indiana Bogeman and Melby Woodson descendants of friends of the Nottoway Tribe of Indians: This day this cause came on to be heard and it appearing to the Court that the said Trustees of the Nottoway Tribe of Indians have been summoned according to Law, and have failed to show cause why the prayers of the petitioners should not be granted. The Court doth adjudge, order & decree that Jas. W. Dacker who is hereby appointed a special commissioner for that purpose shall ascertain the interest of the said Indiana Bogeman & Melby Woodson both in the real & personal estate held in common by the said Nottoway Tribe of Indians and report the same to Court.

On the application of Warren Edwards who is desirous of draining his lands through the lands of Erasmus B. Barrett and Wille M. Barrett it appearing to the Court that ten days previous notice has been given to the proprietors of the said land, and on hearing the matter it is ordered that a writ in the nature of a writ of ad quod damnum to the Sheriff of this County to be directed to be executed according to Law on the day of 1852. which writ with the inquest taken thereon shall be returned to the next Court.
