

Bolt & afterwards transfers to Margaret Cobb (now Hobbs): It appearing that the mistress has had reasonable notice of this complaint, and the parties being fully heard by counsel, the Court doth order that the said Indentures be cancelled and become null and void.

On the motion of Mary Story one of the distributees and with the consent of the other distributees of Mildred Story deceased widow of Lewis Story deceased, who was a soldier in the Virginia Continental line, who made oath as administrator and together with Thomas Blinnell his security interceded and acknowledged alone in the penalty of fifty hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted the said Mary Story for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Mildred Story deceased in due form, which Bond is ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that Benjamin Swaney, John Johnson, B. W. Massenburg & Wm. Brown be appointed commissioners to let to the lowest undertaker the painting of the roof of the Courthouse after it is returned, and the removing of the bar in the Courthouse, substituting therefor Tables & chairs to be enclosed by a railing, or such alterations to said bar as they shall think necessary or preferable, and the painting of the roof of the jail and to receive the same when completed and make report to Court.

The Declaration of Mary Story administrator of Mildred Story was presented to Court claiming the unpaid pension due her from the General Government under the act of Congress passed 19th June 1840. August 16th 23rd 1842, & March 3rd 1843 and the Court having examined the same do certify to the Department of the Interior that Mildred Story above named was the widow of Lewis Story late of said County & that evidence being exhibited to the Court which prove to the satisfaction of the Court, that the said Mildred Story was married to the said Lewis Story some time in the year 1786 and that the said Lewis Story was the identical person who was a United States pensioner at the rate of \$96 per annum a resident of said County who died in said County on the 30th day of April 1837, and that his said widow Mildred Story died in the same County on the 29th day of August 1843, leaving six children now living to wit: William Story, Mills Story, Mary Daugherty, Nancy Story, Mary Story & Henry Story, and that James C. Peterson is an acting Justice of the peace in & for said County duly commissioned and qualified as such and the signature purporting to be his affixed to the papers in the several cases are genuine and that the above named Mary Story was appointed administrator of said Mildred Story by said Court on the 18th day of October 1843, for the purpose of obtaining the unpaid pension from the General Government, which was due the said widow, Mildred Story at the time of her death and the same now claimed by her living children, above named under the several laws of Congress above mentioned.
