On the motion of William J. Scall who made oath and gave bond and security according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of Administration on the Estate of Micajah D. Cole dec'd in his favor.

Ordered that Wm: B. Westbrook, Benj: C. Everett, Fortunatus Dunn, & Jos: S. Jenkins, or any three of them, being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of Micajah D. Cole dec'd that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

Ordered that Edward W. Cumples, Benj: S. Bryant, Elijah Joyce of Miles Daughtry, or any three of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Thomas Burgess dec'd that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

William E. Gay, who has been commissioned a Justice of the Peace in this County in place of Henry P. Connell who failed to qualify as prescribed by Law, to continue in office until the first day of August in the year 1856, by Commission signed by the Governor and under the Great Seal of the Commonwealth. This day appears in Court and qualified as such Justice by taking the several oaths prescribed by Law.
