On the motion of Patience Artis, it is ordered that any overseer of the Poor of this County, do bind her children, John Artis, in his ninth year, & Hanson Artis in his seventh year, to John Barkham, if the Court consider that twelve dollars per annum each (after the apprentices shall arrive to the age of twelve years) will be the reasonable annual value of the services of them in the art, trade, or business they are to be taught: which is to be reserved to be paid to them when they shall arrive to the age of twenty one years respectively; and the overseer of the Poor by whom this order shall be executed shall take bond of the master, for the payment of the sums for which the apprentices are bound.
