

Ordered that Jas. A. Gillette, John Cobb & W^m A. Bell being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels (and real estate of Henry D. Briggs dec^d that may be produced to them & make one return of the same.

" The Proceedings in Decret No 36, 28 this day returned there reports which are ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the next term of this County to take into consideration the propriety of changing the day of the commencement of the term of this Court & to prepare a list of such inhabitants of the County, not exempted, as they shall think well qualified to serve as Jurors.

On the motion of Giles S. Whitney he is exempt from the payment of all Taxes & levies on his negro, Pompey, by Dick they being old & infirm.

On the motion of Winney Warren, free negro, mother of Dick Warren to cancel the Indentures binding him to Nancy Kitchen. This day came the parties by their attorneys (and they being fully heard, it is considered by the Court that the said Indentures be cancelled & that they be come null & void, and that the said Nancy Kitchen pay to the said Winney Warren her costs by her about her suit in this behalf expended.

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The last will & testament of Howell Harris dec^d, was this day proved by the oaths of Jos. W. Cland & Geo. N. Musgrave, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto (and thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James Harris & Theophilus S. Harris the executors therein named who made oath (and together with Joseph W. Cland, Robert S. Jones & W. E. Ryland his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into (and acknowledged), a bond in the penalty of thirty five thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form.

Ordered that W^m A. Jones, Jos. S. Cland, Jas. Drewry & Jas. H. Beeson any three of them, being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels (and real estate of Howell Harris dec^d that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

" On the motion of W^m E. Myrick he is exempted from the payment of all Taxes & levies, on his negro, Jim they being old & infirm.
