

Ordered that the Clerk register Elias Lee free negro who was born free in this County as appears by the testimony of Elisha Pope.

The commissioners appointed to let to the lowest undertaker the repairs or rebuilding of the Flat Swamp bridge at Hobart this day made their report which is ordered to be filed.

On the motion of Ananias Warren, free negro, the Consent of the Court is granted him to bind his infant child Nancy Warren to Drury Bond.

Ordered that the black register Ananias Warren and Sally Warren free negroes, who were born free in this County as appears by the testimony of Drury Bond.

Ordered that James Guley and Jos. H. Bishop, being sworn for the purpose do appraise (with the appraisers heretofore appointed) all the goods or chattels of Silas Ellsworth dec'd that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

On the motion of W^m Munfer guardian of James H. Parker it is ordered that the unadministered estate of W^m Harrison be committed to the hands of Sam^l Kello Sheriff of this County to be administered according to law.

On the motion of W^m Munfer guardian of James H. Parker, it is ordered that the unadministered estate of Harrison Cobb dec'd be committed to the hands of Sam^l Kello Sheriff of this County to be administered according to law.

On the motion of W^m Munfer guardian of James H. Parker it is ordered that the unadministered estate of Maria Parker dec'd be committed to the hands of Sam^l Kello Sheriff of this County to be administered according to law.

McWing purporting to be the last Will and testament of Henry Moore dec'd together with a writing purporting to be a codicil thereto, were produced in Court and there being no subscribing witnesses thereto, W^m A. Jones & Nathan N. Thomas were sworn, and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the hand writing of the testator and truly believe the said writings (and the names thereto subscribed to) to be wholly written by the testator's own hand. Whereupon the said writings are ordered to be received as the true last will and testament and codicil thereto of the said Henry Moore deceased. And on the motion of W^m Harrison the executors therein named who made oath (and together with Mark A. James, James R. Joyner, & William A. Joyner, his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged above in the penalty of fifteen thousand Dollars conditioned according to law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Robert L. Jones, Jos. A. Person, James H. Person, N. N. Thomas & W. H. Chickhead (or any three of them) being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Henry Moore deceased that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.
