And on the motion of Eliza Porter the Executrix therein named who made oath and gave bond and security according to Law, Corliss' sale is granted her for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form

Ordered that James H. Prou, John E. Biggs, Asst. Agents of William S. Francis or any three of them, being for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Richard Porter dec^d that may be produced to them if return the same under their hands according to Law.
