

Samuel Wells Sheriff of this County returned an account of Jany Claims paid by him since June Court 1851, amounting to \$117.24 which was examined by the Court and allowed.

Samuel Wells Sheriff of this County returned sundry lists of Insolvent County Lewis amounting to \$185.70, which were examined by the Court and allowed.

Samuel Wells Sheriff of this County this day presented to the Court several lists of Taxes assessed other than on real estate, to-wit: one for \$184.00 and another for \$16.40 which lists having been examined by the Court (and the Court being) satisfied of the correctness of the same, (and also satisfied that copies of said lists were posted up at the front door of the Courthouse of this County, on about day during the next term preceding this, it is ordered that copies thereof be certified to the first Auditor.

The Commissioners appointed to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of Upper Beacreek bridge this day made their report which is ordered to be filed.

Ordered that the account of H^d W. Riggs Justice of this County amounting to \$5.90 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

Ordered that the account of Franklin Turner Constable of this County amounting to \$6.68 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

Ordered that the account of Andrew J. Wells amounting to \$8.46 be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment.

The last Will and testament of Mary Riggs dec^d was proved by the oath of James S. Dringbold one of the subscribing witnesses thereto, (and S. J. Mahone the other subscribing witness thereto being dead, James S. Dringbold testified that S. J. Mahone (and himself) agree thereto will at the same time in the presence of each other and in the presence of the testator at his request, (and Samuel Wells and Henry S. Howard being sworn, dep^os. and say that they were well acquainted with the handwriting of the said S. J. Mahone (and that they verily believe that the name of the said S. J. Mahone signed to the said will as a witness is in the proper handwriting of the said S. J. Mahone, thereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of H^d W. Riggs the executor thereof named who made oath and gave bond and security according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form.

Ordered that the account be adjourned till the first day of the next term.
