The last Will and Testament of Thomas D. Knight deceased was this day proved by the oaths of Benjamin C. Pope & George C. Pope two of the subscribing witnesses thereto (and thereupon ordered to be recorded) And Benjamin C. Pope the executor therein this day appeared in Court & refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof.

The report of a Jury relative to a disputed line between Giles S. McHenry and Andrew Lawrence (and the exceptions thereto, were this day argued by Counsel, whereupon it is ordered that the said report be set aside and that the Surveyor of this County with a jury do lay off and procure the bounds so in dispute at the charge of the party against whom the right to such bounds shall be determined and return such survey with the proceedings thereon to the next Court after the survey shall be made.

The order heretofore made by this Court committing the undivided estate of David J. Boykin deceased to the hands of the Sheriff of this County is set aside; and on the motion of John P. Boykin who made oath together with Allen Stephenson and W^m D. Stephenson his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) interest into (and acknowledges) a bond in the penalty of twenty five thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration de bonis non with the will annexed on the estate of said David J. Boykin deceased int due form.

Provided that Allen Stephenson, Alfred Stephenson, James Jones and Henry Crumpler or any three of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of David J. Boykin deceased.
