On the motion of Levi Waller guardian of Martha Waller it is ordered that the order made at the May term last of this Court be so amended as that he be allowed to expend the sum of sixteen dollars instead of ten dollars of the principal of his ward's estate for the payment of a medical bill.

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Ordered that the estate of Samuel Gardner dec<sup>d</sup> which is now unadministered be committed to the hands of Sam<sup>l</sup>. Wells Sheriff of this County to be administered according to Law.

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The Court doth certify that Walter Inghisb duly qualified in this Court on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1817, as the Administrator of Anthony Millen dec<sup>d</sup>, and that such qualification is with the consent of the heirs of said deceased, and doth further certify on satisfactory evidence produced before it that the said Anthony Millen is the same person of that name who was private of Capt Rich<sup>d</sup>.
