Fraix Company of Virginia Volunteers during the war of 1812 with Great Britain and that the following persons are the only heirs of said deceased: to wit; Simon E. Newson and W^m. Newson, cousins of said deceased.

W^m. W. Biggs, Jailor of this County this day reported to the Court that Richard S. Vick is now confined in Jail as a Lunatic, whereupon the Court appointed Dr. Thomas H. Vignebart and W^m. R. Parker to enquire into the state of mind of the said Richard S. Vick and they withdrew (and after some time returned into Court and reported, that they find the said Richard S. Vick to be labouring under a religious monomania.

W^m. W. Biggs, who has been appointed by the Board of School Commissioners of the County of Southampton Superintendent of Schools for said County, for the year commencing the first day of January 1856, this day appeared in Court (and entered into and acknowledged bonds with security conditioned according to law.

The Court doth assign Zachariah Dozal guardian of Elizabeth V. Harris, Harriet Harris, & Martha J. Harris Orphans of John Harris deceased. Whereupon he gave bond and security according to Law.

William Prince who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this County and within the jurisdiction of this Court, in this, that he did on the 20th day of September A.D. 1855 in the County of Southampton unlawfully and maliciously strike, beat and wound Augustus S. McCreethrook with intent to maim, disfigure, disable the said Augustus S. McCreethrook and by other means cause him bodily injury with the said intent. This day appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into before James C. Deane a Justice of the Peace in this County and was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County, and the Court having heard the evidence are of opinion that a felony has been committed and that there is probable cause to charge the accused there with murder in the first degree of which he stands charged before the Circuit Court of this County. And the said William Prince moved the Court to be allowed to enter into a recognizance with security for his appearance before the said Circuit Court, which motion the Court entertained, and allowed the said William Prince to enter into such recognizance himself in the sum of two hundred Dollars with a sufficient security in a like sum of two hundred Dollars.
