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respectively of their goods and chattels lands and tenements: Yet upon this condition that if the said William Dince shall personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court of Southampton County on the first day of the next term of that Court to answer the Complainant's oath of and concerning the felony of which he stands charged in this that he did on the 20th day of September A.D. 1853 in the County of Southampton unlawfully and maliciously strike, beat and wound Augustus E. Westbrook with intent to maim, disfigure, disable the said Augustus E. Westbrook and by other means cause him bodily injury with the said intent, and shall not thence depart without the leave of the said Court, then the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

The Court doth assign William Morris guardian of Joseph C. Morris orphan of William D. Morris. Whereupon the said William Morris together with Alfred Morris his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one hundred and twenty Dollars conditioned according to law.

The Court doth assign Hester Morris guardian of Lenama and Olimia M. Morris orphans of William D. Morris. Whereupon the said Hester Morris together with Alfred Morris and Robert D. Jones her securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars conditioned according to law.

Richard S. Vick a citizen of this State, who is confined in the Jail of this County as lunatic, upon the application of Elizabeth Phillips is delivered to her to be restrained and taken proper care of, and thereupon she gave bond and security conditioned according to law.

A Deed of Relinquishment from Bartholomew Simmons and Elizabeth his wife was acknowledged in open Court by the said Bartholomew Simmons and Elizabeth his wife aforesaid being examined by one of the Justices of the Court privately and apart from her husband and having the said deed fully explained to her, she acknowledged the same to be her act and declared that she had executed it willingly and does not wish to retract it; Whereupon the said Deed is ordered to be recorded.
