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It appearing to the Court that the summons and suggestion has been duly executed on said A. S. H. Burgess & he appearing in Court in obedience thereto admits in oath that he has in hands belonging to the defendant a sufficient sum of money to pay or satisfy the amount of the claim of the plaintiff. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the said A. S. H. Burgess pay to the plaintiff the sum of \$19.99 with Interest from 19th June 1843, full paid & \$1.10 costs costs and also the costs of the proceedings herein.

The Court doth assign Elijah Joyner, guardian of Edward L. Everett, Alice B. Everett & Calist Everett orphans of Calist Everett dec^d. Whereupon he gave bond and security according to Law.

On the motion of Silas S. Whitney and for reasons appearing to the Court It is ordered that our Overseer of the Poor of this County do bind to him the said Whitney, Goodman Feeney aged nine years, Elmira Feeney aged seven years, William Feeney aged five years and Junius Feeney aged three years - and that he pay to Goodman for his services the sum of \$10.00 when he arrives to the age of twenty one years, to Elmira for her services the sum of \$75.00 when she arrives to the age of eighteen years, to William the sum of \$75.00 for his services when he arrives to the age of twenty one years and to Junius the sum of \$50.00 when he arrives to the age of twenty one years for his services. And the overseer of the Poor by whom this order shall be executed shall take from the master bonds for the payment of the said sums of money.

Order, that the Court be adjourned till the first day of the next term.
