Ordered that Irvin Griffin, Arrington Gardner and Willis Brass-haw being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of Eli Joyner dec^d that may be produced to them and make due return of the same.

The last Will and testament of Littleton Moore dec^d, was this day proved by the oath of Eddick Bayett and Littleton A. Gay the subscribing witnesses thereto (and thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Harison D. Moore, William C. Gay and Solomon D. Daugherty the executors therein named, who made oath and together with W^m. W. Briggs, W^m D. Parker, John Moore (and George W. Lawrence their securities, (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into, and acknowledged abond in the penalty of ten thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat of the said will of Littleton Moore dec^d in due form.

Ordered that James D. Bryant, Jeremiah Willeford and George W. Lawrence being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Littleton Moore dec^d that may be produced to them (and make due return of the same.

Ordered that the Clerk register Ferdy Hicks free negro, who was born free in this County as appears by the testimony of F. J. Bellin and Jane Walker free negro who was born free in this County as appears by the testimony of Shugars Laid.

On the motion of Alfred S. Stephenson, guardian of Ann Maria & Sarah Browne Washington he is allowed to expend the sum of \$180.00 of the principal of his said ward's estate for their support, education &c. This year.

On the motion of Peter Sharp, gentleman, who has been licensed to practice law in the Courts of this Commonwealth, he is permitted to qualify in this Court. Whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by Law.

A Writing purporting to be the last Will and testament of William Dawson dec^d bearing date the 18th day of January 1856, was this day produced in Court by Arrington Gardner the Executor therein named in order to be proved and Martha Dawson, the wife of the said testator appeared and opposed the proof of
