This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly and on the report of the Commissioners made at the last term of this Court to which report no exceptions having been filed was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof the Court approving and confirming said report doth adjudge, order and decree that the same be held firm and stable and binding between the parties forever, and that the costs be proportionably borne by the parties.

The Account of Theophilus H. Harris' Executorial proceedings on the estate of Howell Harris dec'd and of James Harris' Executorial proceedings on the estate of Howell Harris dec'd having lain one month & upwards in the Clerk's office and there being no exceptions thereto were examined confirmed & ordered to be recorded.

On the Application of Joseph H. Durham to alter the road from Bethlehem Cross roads to the Cross Keys road near said Durham's house. The Commissioners appointed to view the ground proposed for opening said road, this day made their report. On consideration whereof the Court adopted and confirmed said report and appointed William Hargraves, Lewis Sharp & E. C. Magee Commissioners to lay out the said road altered as proposed by the said Joseph H. Durham at the expense of the said Durham and have the same put in good repair & report to Court.

Geo. W. Spring, Wm^{ly} Stephenson, Alfred T. Stephenson & W^{rs} H. Perkins (any three of whom may act) are appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest and undertake the repairs of Lower Sea Lock bridge, and receive the same when completed & make report to Court.

The last will and testament of Martha A. Dimec dec'd was this day further proved by the oath of M^r A. Jones subscribing witness thereto, and the same having been proved by the oath of W^m H. Drury also a subscribing witness thereto, at the October term of this Court 1836, was then and is now ordered to be recorded. John Dimec the executor therein named refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof. And on the motion of W^m S. Goodwyn who made ^{oath} and together with E. T. Bidley his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty four hundred dollars conditioned as the Law directs. Certificate is granted the said Goodwyn for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of the said Martha A. Dimec dec'd with her will annexed in due form.

Ordered that Paul Drury, James Drury and John Williams being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods & chattels of Martha A. Dimec dec'd that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.
