

Taxes on \$1100. more than he should have been charged and the Court being satisfied that the error exists and the applicant is entitled to relief, and it also appearing to the Court that the sum of four dollars and forty cents has been paid to the Sheriff, it is ordered that the said sum of four dollars and forty cents be refunded to him the said M^r H. Hood. The attorney for the Commonwealth was present defending this application.

Henry M. Butts, C. F. Vignault, Henry Mayler & Bennett S. Briggs (any three of whom may act) are appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest bidder the repairs or rebuilding of Tammis Bridge, provided it does not exceed \$300.00 and receive the same when completed & make report to Court.

The last will and Testament of Henry Bishop decd. was this day proved by the oaths of Thos. B. McMill and George St. Bailey the subscribing witnesses thereto and thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Mills D. Sumner one of the executors therein named who made oath and together with Saml. Skello and John Dretlow, his securities, (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged, alone in the penalty of two hundred Dollars conditioned as the last directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said ^{will} in due form. Liberty is reserved to Thomas B. McMill the other executor therein named to join in the probat when he shall think fit.

Ordered that Thomas B. McMill, Robert Barnes and Elijah Jeyner, being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of Henry Bishop decd that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

Cass Holland having obtained an attachment against the goods and chattels of Olisha B. Williams for \$152.50 for rent which will become due & payable the 1st day of January 1856 and Edwin R. Long one of the Constables in this County by virtue thereof levied on (here insert the Levy). For reasons appearing to the Court this case is continued to the next term.

Benjamin C. McAllen having obtained an attachment against the goods & chattels of Olisha B. Williams for \$107.67 which became due & payable the 11th day of November 1856 and Japhet T. Murrell a Constable appointed for that purpose in this County by virtue thereof levied on (here insert the Levy). For reasons appearing to the Court this case is continued until the next term.

The Free Negroes in this County not having paid their taxes & levies and not having visible property out of which they may be made by distress, it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County bid out such of them as have not paid them, for such time as will suffice at not less than ten cents a day to raise the said Taxes and levies, with a Commission to the Sheriff of
