

Taxes on \$1100, more than he should have been charged and the Court being satisfied that the case exists and the applicant is entitled to relief, and it also appearing to the Court that the sum of four dollars and fifty cents has been paid to the Sheriff, it is ordered that the said sum of four dollars and fifty cents be refunded to him the said Mr. H. Hood. The attorney for the Commonwealth was present defending this application.

Henry M. Butts, C. F. Vaughan, Henry Mayle & Bennett S. Briggs (any three of whom may act) are appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest bidder the repair or rebuilding of Farmers Bridge, provided it does not exceed \$300.00 and receive the same when completed & make report to Court.

The last will and Testament of Henry Bishop deceased was this day proved by the oaths of Thos. B. McDonell and George H. Bailey the subscribing witnesses thereto and thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Mills D. Sumner one of the executors therein named who made oath (and to swear with Saml. Kelle and John Gitterer, his securities, (who justify'd at oath as to their sufficiency) entered into (and acknowledge d above in the penalty of Two hundred Dollars conditioned as the last directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said ^{will} in due form. Liberty is reserved to Thomas B. McDonell the other executor therein named to join in the probat when he shall think fit.

Ordered that Thomas B. McDonell, Robert Barnes and Elijah Payne, being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods & chattels of Henry Bishop deceased that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

Carl Holland having obtained an attachment against the goods and chattels of Eliska R. Williams for \$152.50 for rent which will become due & payable the 1st day of January 1856. and Edwin R. Stony one of the Constables in this County by virtue thereof levied on her in the Levy. For reasons appearing to the Court this case is continued to the next term.

Benjamin C. Waller having obtained an attachment against the goods & chattels of Eliska R. Williams for \$107 67 which became due & payable the 11th day of November 1856 and Jasper T. Murrell a constable appointed for that purpose in this County by virtue thereof levied on her in the Levy. For reasons appearing to the Court this case is continued until the next term.

The Free Negroes in this County not having paid their taxes & levies and not having visible property out of which they may be made by distress, it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County hire out each of them at least not less than ten cents a day to raise the said Taxes and Levies, with a Commission to the Sheriff of
