W^m R. Stephenson Constable in District No. 6 in this County Ohio, has resigned his office aforesaid.

A vacancy existing in District No. 6 in the number of Constables this County is filled by the resignation of W^m R. Stephenson. It is ordered that a writ of election be issued directed to the Commissioners of Conductors of general elections to hold an election to supply said vacancy on the second Saturday in January 1857.

The Consent of the Court is granted to Mary Carter (see supra) to bind her minor children George Washington aged 11 years September 1st 1856 and John Wesley aged 9 years July 13th 1856 to Richard L. Broughton. The said Broughton to pay to the said mother the sum of Ten dollars per year for the said George, during his minority except for the last year (and a sufficient sum to the said apprentice for the last year to make the whole amount) \$20.00. And to pay to the mother the sum of twelve dollars per year for the services of the said John during his apprenticeship except for the last year (and a sufficient sum to the said apprentice for the last year to make the whole sum) \$120.00 in the art and mystery of farming in which they are to be taught.

Upon satisfactory evidence presented to the Court it doth certify that Ann Edmunds widow of John Edmunds to whom County Land Warrant No. 84,715 for eighty acres of land under the act of Congress of March 3rd 1850 (and which warrant is dated the 16th day of May 1856) departed this life on the 6th day of September 1856 intestate leaving as her only heirs at Law, William Fuller, and John James Fuller nephews of the whole blood. The said William being of the age of twenty one years (majority) and the said John being a minor. And the guardian of the said John is directed and allowed to make sale of the said warrant as real estate (and to report to this Court
