

The Court again William A. Jones guardian of Rebecca L. Corbett orphan of William L. Corbett dec'd. (who hereupon he together with Albert B. News, his security, (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged above in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs.

Edwin L. Turner who stands charged with a felony by him committed in this County and within the jurisdiction of this Court in that he did on the 15th of June and in the year 1857, shoot at Albert B. News with intent to maim, disfigure or kill this day appears in Court and on the motion of the attorney for the Commonwealth (and for reasons appearing to the Court this examination is continued until the next term.

Albert B. News with W^m A. Jones his security came into Court and acknowledged themselves to be severally indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$2000.00 each of their respective lands and tenements, goods and chattels to be levied and for the use of the said Commonwealth rendered: Yet upon this condition that if the said Albert B. News ^{and John B. News his wife} shall make his personal appearance before the Justices of this Court on the first day of the next June term to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against Edwin L. Turner and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void.

William R. Westbrooke for W^m R. Magee arrived came into Court and acknowledged himself to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$2000.00 of his lands and tenements, goods and chattels to be levied (and for the use of the said Commonwealth rendered: Yet upon this condition that if the said W^m R. Magee shall make his personal appearance before the Justices of this Court on the first day of the next June term to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against Edwin L. Turner and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then this recognizance to be void.

John W. Stitt with W^m R. Westbrooke his security came into Court and acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$2000.00 each of their respective lands and tenements, goods and chattels to be levied (and for the use of the said Commonwealth rendered: Yet upon this condition that if the said John W. Stitt shall make his personal appearance before the Justices of this Court on the first day of the next June term to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against Edwin L. Turner and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then this recognizance to be void.

W^m R. Sanders with John W. Stitt his security came into Court and acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of \$2000.00 each of their respective lands and tenements, goods and chattels to be levied (and for the use of the said Commonwealth rendered: Yet upon this condition that if the said W^m R. Sanders shall make his personal appearance before the Justices of this Court at the next term (June) to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth against Edwin L. Turner and shall not depart thence without the leave of the Court then this recognizance to be void.
