The Commissioners in this case this day made their report.

Ordered that the undistributed estate of Nancy Pope do be committed to the hands of Mr. W. Rejz, Sheriff of this County to be administered according to Law.

Ordered that Allen Jagers guardian of Mary M. Pope be allowed to expend the sum of \$10.00 of the principal of the said estate to pay Mary Drake for the board of the said ward from 5<sup>th</sup> Decr. 1855 to 5<sup>th</sup> of June 1856.

Ordered that Allan Jagers, John Booth, Robert Stephenson of Mr. Beeson (any three of whom may act) be appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of one of Sarara bridges and receive the same when completed and make report to Court.

Ordered that E. C. Maget, John H. Stitt, Jesse Little of Orquid Nelsons any three of whom may act) be appointed Commissioners to let to the lowest bidder the repairs of Camps bridge (provided the same can be done for less than \$500.00) and receive the same when completed and make report to Court.

Edwin L. Sumner who stands charged with a felony by him committed in the County of Southampton and within the jurisdiction of this Court, in that he did on the 15<sup>th</sup> of January in the year 1857, shoot Albert B. News with intent to maim, disfigure or kill him. This day again appeared in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1857, before C. A. Hay and Thomas Vaughan two of the Justices of the Peace of this County and was set to the bar in custody of the Sheriff of this County and the Court having heard the evidence are of opinion that a felony has been committed, and that there is probable cause to charge the said Edwin L. Sumner therewith, and doth remand him for trial in the Circuit Court of this County. The said Edwin L. Sumner moves the Court to be allowed to give bail in the sum of five hundred Dollars for his appearance before the said Circuit Court, which motion the Court entertained and allowed the said Edwin L. Sumner to give the said bail in the sum of five hundred Dollars and the said Sumner being a minor Mr. B. Westbrook here in Court acknowledged himself to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of five hundred Dollars to be made and levied of his goods and chattels, lands and tenements and to the use of the said Commonwealth rendered; Yet upon this condition that if the said Edwin L. Sumner do shall personally appear before the Judge of the Circuit Court of this County on the first day after the next term of to answer the Commonwealth of and concerning the offence with he stands charged, and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then the above recognizance shall be void, else to remain in full force and virtue.
