

Motion they were solemnly called but came not. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendants £28 0s with interest at £3 9s 2d from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1853 to the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1854 and on £251. 11s the residue thereof from the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of March 1854 to the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1854 together with fifteen per centum per annum damages on the whole amount from the said 23<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1854 till payment and his costs by him in this behalf expended.

On the motion of Iron Gay against Patrick Dales and Samuel Hill  
Sons & Co. of the late William Whitney late Constable of the County of South  
ampton. This day came the plaintiff by his attorney (and it appearing to the  
satisfaction of the Court that the defendants have had legal notice of this  
motion they were solemnly called, but came not) therefore it is considered  
by the Court that the plaintiff recover against the defendants £13 6s 2d with  
interest thereon from the 13<sup>th</sup> day of March 1849, to the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March  
1855 and also £6 8s 0d with interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1850  
to the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1855, together with fifteen per centum per annu-  
mum damages on the whole or both amounts from the said 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March  
1855, till paid and his costs by him in this behalf expended.

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County summon all the acting Justices of this  
County to the next term of this Court to take into consideration the propriety  
of restoring the Embankments at the Upperbridge and at the bridge near  
Jerusalem to the Surveyors of the respective roads leading to them and authoriz-  
ing the said Surveyors to employ labour to keep up the said embankments.

Ordered that the Clerk register Tabitha, Julia, Becky, Jenny and children  
Jane and Jim, Ephraim, Henry and Dick, negroes manumitted by the will of Jacob  
Barnes deceased and Charlotte Buck, friend, who was born free in this County as  
appears by the testimony of Solomon Barnes.

Edwin Bradshaw who has been elected a constable in District No 6 in this County  
this day appears in Court and together with Nelson D. Deller, Sam Gifford,  
Abraham Rorshaw and Thomas J. Burtis, his securities (who certifies on oath as to  
their sufficiency) bound into and acknowledged a sum in the penalty of five thousand  
dollars conditioned according to Law. Whereas upon the said Edwin Bradshaw ap-  
peared in Court and qualified as Constable by taking the several oaths presented  
by Law.
