George A. Pack agent for Nancy Gould having obtained an attachment against the goods and effects of H. W. Gray & Co. for the sum of fifty dollars payable the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December 1857, and Present S. Thomas one of the constables of this County by virtue thereof having levied on 1 Baggage and Harness 1 Steam saw Mill, 175,000 feet lumber more or less 1/3 work over, 8 miles, 1 work Horse, 2 Hackebrazons, 6 wds of Carts, 3 Pairs and Furniture, 1 Cooking Stove & fixtures of the said goods and effects of the said H. W. Gray & Co. who intend to remove their effects out of this Commonwealth. This day came the Plaintiff by his attorney and the defendants being solemnly called and not appearing to respond thereto it is caused by the Court that the Plaintiff recover against the defendants the sum of \$500 dollars the debt advanced with legal interest thereon from the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December 1857, all paid, and his costs by him in this behalf expended. And it is ordered that the said Person S. Thomas make sale of the Harness by him attached as the law directs and out of the money arising from such sale pay and satisfy this judgment to the plaintiff and restore the overplus, if any, to the defendant and return an account of such sale to the next Court and the said attachment is continued as to the other property levied on.

The last Will and testament of Joseph Branch deceased was partly proved by the oath of William C. Leavenworth one of the subscribing witnesses thereto and is continuing further proof.
