The Court doth appoint E. M. Maffett, Samuel B. Kells and John E. Pope Commissioners to superintend elections of Militia Officers in this regiment.

On the motion of Richard B. L. Everett who made oath and together with James C. Everett and Richard L. Bryant his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged above in the penalty of Two hundred dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Mary L. Everett dec'd. in due form.

Ordered that the Clerk register Louis Detour foreigner, who was banished in this County as appears by the testimony of Maffett B. Kells.

who severally produced the Sheriff's receipts for the Tax imposed by Law a License is granted each of them to keep an ordinary at their respective houses in this County until the next April term of this Court. It being the opinion of the Court that each of them is sober and of good character and will probably keep a house as is by useful and such as the Law requires. Whereupon they severally appeared in Court and severally entered into bonds in the penalty of Two hundred dollars with sufficient security conditioned according to Law and severally took the oath prescribed by Law.

The Court doth assign Susan J. Kashner guardian of James M. & Margaret C. Williams orphans of Simeon L. Williams dec'd. Whereupon she together with Jeremiah M. Williams his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged above in the penalty of Two hundred dollars conditioned according to Law.

Briggs Sheriff of this County this day presented to the Court several lists of Captations taken aforesaid in which males and foreigners which cannot be collected taxes; one amounting to \$17.60, one \$17.60, one \$45.60, one \$16.80, one \$13.00, one \$12.00, and one \$2.00 which lists having been verified by the oath of the Sheriff and having been examined by the Court (and the Court being satisfied of the correctness of the same and also being satisfied that copies of said lists were posted up at the front door of the Court house of this County on a Court day during the next term preceding this term, it is ordered that copies thereof be certified to the Justices.

The Court taking into consideration the propriety of permitting the merchants in this County to sell by retail certain spirits, wine &c a motion thereof decided to grant permission to such Applicants as were deemed fit and proper persons and the further consideration of the subject is adjourned until the next term.
