On the motion of Allen Edwards adm^r. of Re. J. Edwards dec^d who is bonded in this Court as the security of Seth D. Williams as guardian of Mary E. and Laura Hammons. After day come as well the said plaintiff by his attorney as the said Seth D. Williams in his proper person and they being fully heard, it is ordered that the said Seth D. Williams execute a new bond in the penalty of \$4000.00 as guardian aforesaid conditioned according to Law or have his powers as guardian revoked and that he pay the costs of this motion. Whereupon the said Seth D. Williams appeared (and together with Thomas J. Britton, Joshua Britton & Jonathan Dawson, his securities, (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency,) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of \$4000.00 as guardian aforesaid conditioned according to Law.

On the Application of Edgah Joynes, & W^m M. Beaton

who severally produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law, a License is granted each of them to keep an ordinary at their respective houses in this County, until the next April Term of this Court. It being the opinion of the Court that each of them is sober and of good character and will probably keep a house really useful and such as the Law requires. Whereupon they severally in open Court entered into bonds in the penalty of Five hundred Dollars each with sufficient security, conditioned according to Law, and severally took the oath prescribed by Law.

The Justices having been summoned to consider the subject under an o.c. made at the last term of this Court, the Court doth appoint, Saml. Drury, Thomas M. Dawson, Seth A. Bishop, W^m A. Summerville, James Jones, Donatus L. Dales, John Cobb, Edwin Thomas, John E. Briggs, William Edwards, W^m E. Gay, Henry M. Dutton, B. J. Bryant, and James D. Bryant Commissioners of Peace for this County until the next May term of this Court. And the Court agree to pay them two Dollars a day for their services each while employed.

On the motion of Shuman A. Longene, Geo. C. Pope, James J. Brotherton, & Allen E. Joynes & Co. Merchants of this County who wish their License to include permissive travel by retail and at Spirits wine is a mixture thereof, at their respective stores in this County and who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the tax imposed by Law, the Court doth certify that they are persons of good character and see no objection to granting such permission. Whereupon they severally in open Court entered into bonds in the penalty of Five hundred Dollars each with sufficient security conditioned according to Law and severally took the oath prescribed by Law.

The Commissioners appointed to advertise for and receive sealed proposals for letting to the lowest bidder the repair of Hancock Swamp bridge. Day pay made them upon returning the proposals received by them, and it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County summon all the acting Justices of this County to the next term of this Court to take into consideration the accepting or rejecting said proposals.
