Bryant, John W. Hanson's Executorial proceedings on the estate of Amy Moore, Allen C. Seignies guardianship of Martha J. Pope, Mary W. Pope, Frederick A. Pope, George B. Pope, & W<sup>m</sup> A. Pope, James Claydon's transactions as Committee of Belvidere Ely alimative, of Levi Handley's transactions as Curator of the estate of Eli Jeynes decd., of Samuel Dole's transactions as trustee in deed of trust made by Peter Gay grantor & of W<sup>m</sup> M. Beaton's transactions as trustee in deed of trust made by Edward Beaton grantor. Having severally laid on. month and upwards in the Clerk's office and there being no exceptions thereto were examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded.

Frederick S. Dunn who has been elected Constable in District No 1 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858, together with W<sup>m</sup> B. Webster and W<sup>m</sup> D. Davis, his Sureties, entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars conditions according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths presented by law which bond is ordered to be recorded.

John Warham who has been elected Commissioner of the Revenue for St. Lukes Parish in this County for the term of two years commencing the 1st day of January 1859 together with Harrison S. Pope & Geo. L. Pope his Sureties entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of one thousand Dollars conditions according to law. Whereupon he took the several oaths presented by law which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of William Edwards who made oath and together with Jos. C. Galletti and Jonathan Dondan, his Sureties (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged abroad in the penalty of sixteen hundred Dollars conditions according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Martha M. Vaughan decd. in due form.
