3 In Chancery

This day this cause came out to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the report of the Commissioner made at the last term of this Court to which no exceptions have been filed and was argued by Counsel. Bryant, John W. Hansen's Executive proceedings on the estate of Henry Moon, Abram C. Symmes guardian ship of Martha J. Pope, Mary M. Pope, Frederick A. Pope, George P. Pope, Wm. A. Pope, James Clayton's transactions as Committee of Relicellis City almanac, of Livermore's transactions as Curator of the estate of Edw. Joyce deceased, of Samuel L. Dol's transactions as trustee in Deed of trust made by Leon Gay grantor of Wm. M. Beaton's transactions as trustee in Deed of trust made by Edward Beaton grantor, having severally been made in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law, which bond is deemed to be record.

Farmers Dunn who has been elected Commissioner in District No 1 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858, together with Wm. E. Blalock and Wm. J. Harris his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law, which bond is deemed to be record.

John Barbant who has been elected Commissioner of the Revenue for St. Lukes Parish in this County for the term of two years commencing the 1st day of January 1859 together with Hammill S. Pope & Geo. C. Pope his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law, which bond is deemed to be record.

On the motion of William Edwards who made out and together with Jos. E. Giddeth and Jonathan Darden his securities, (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of sixteen hundred Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Martha M. Vary having died in decrimum.
