

George A. Swell who has been elected Constable in District No 2 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858, together with John Whitehead and John T. Swell his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On the application of William Jenkins to alter the road near his home leading from his fork of road near his home to Saraford. The Commissioners appointed to view the ground proposed for opening said road this day made their report which being considered by the Court and the Court adopting and confirming the same doth allow the said Jenkins to alter the said road as proposed and appoint Alfred F. Stephens and W. M. Clayton Commissioners to receive the said road when the same shall have been opened or altered and put in good repair. But this road is to be opened at the expense of the said Jenkins.

For reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that an indenture of the Poor of this County do bind Jim Artis aged about 18 years, Priscilla Artis aged about 15 years and Alfred Artis aged about 12 years to W^m E. Beale, - And it is ordered that the master to pay for the services of the apprentice Jim Artis \$50.00 per year to be retained and paid to him when he arrives to the age of twenty one years without interest and to pay for the services of the apprentices Priscilla Artis and Alfred Artis each \$30.00 per year to be retained and paid to them when they respectively become free without interest. and the Overseer of the poor by whom this indenture shall be executed shall take from the master bond for the payment of said sums.

Collier School who has been elected Constable in District No 5 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858 together with Arlington Garrison and Joshua Britton his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he made solemn affirmation to the oaths prescribed by law - which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of W^m W. Briggs Sheriff of this County R. M. Wren is permitted to qualify as his Deputy it being the opinion of the Court that he is a man of honesty probity and good domestic - whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law.

The Board of the Overseers of the poor of this County this day made also a supplemental report which is ordered to be filed.
