

George A. Sowell who has been elected Constable in District No 2 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858, together with John Whithead and John T. Sowell his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On the application of William Jenkins to alter the road near his house leading from his farm off road near his house to Danapoint - The Commissioners appointed to view the ground proposed for opening said road this day made their report which being considered by the Court and the Court adopting and confirming the same doth allow the said Jenkins to alter the said road as proposed. And appoint Alfred G. Stephens and M. M. Clayton Commissioners to receive the said road when the same shall have been opened or altered and put in good repair. But this road is to be opened at the expense of the said Jenkins.

For reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that an overseer of the poor of this County do bind Jim Atis aged about 18 years, Grizzilla Atis aged about 15 years and Alfred Atis aged about 12 years to Al<sup>l</sup> E. Beale. - And it is ordered that the master pay for the services of the apprentices Jim Atis \$50.00 per year to be retained and paid to him when he arrives to the age of twenty one years without interest and to pay for the services of the apprentices Grizzilla Atis and Alfred Atis each \$30.00 per year to be retained and paid to them what they respectively become free without interest. And the Overseer of the poor by whom this order shall be executed shall take from the master bonds for the payment of said sums.

Collin Hitchcock who has been elected Constable in District No 5 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858 together with Arington Garrison & Joshua Pittman his securities, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of five thousand dollars conditioned according to law, whereupon he made solemn affirmation to the oaths prescribed by law - which bond is ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of Al<sup>l</sup> W. Briggs Sheriff of this County Ro. M. Wren is permitted to qualify as his Deputy by giving the opinion of the Court that he is a man of honesty probity and good character - Whereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by law.

The Board of the overseers of the poor of this County this day made also a supplemental report which is ordered to be filed.
