Decree as per decree filed.

On the motion of Littlebury Mason who is bound in this Court at the County of William Prince guardian of Andrew J. Prince. It is ordered that the said Andrew J. Prince be summoned to appear here instantaneously to show cause if any he can why he should not be required to give a new bond as guardian aforesaid. Whereupon he appeared in Court and acknowledged notice of this motion and the parties being heard it is ordered that the said Prince execute a new bond with security in the penalty of Two thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs and the said Prince refusing to give the said bond as required it is ordered that the Powers of the said Prince be revoked and annulled and that he pay the costs of this motion. And the Court doth adjudge William J. S. Clements guardian of Andrew J. Prince orphan of William Prince deceased. Whereupon he to get a writ Littlebury Mason his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars conditioned according to Law.

The last Will and Testament of Sam'l C. Hart deceased was this day proved by the oaths of H. D. McQuhart, Jhos. Pittman, two of the subscribers witnesses thereto and was thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of W^m St. Summersell the attorney named who made oath and together with Thomas J. Brister, his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty five hundred Dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Thomas Pittman, Julian J. Branch, Bartholomew Bowers and H. D. McQuhart, or any three of them, being sworn for the purpose do appropriate all the goods or chattels of Samuel C. Hart deceased that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

The Court doth adjudge William C. Beale guardian of Lydia C. Beale, Jno. T. Beale and Edw^t D. Beale - whereupon he together with Thomas B. Ward, Parker D. Tracy, Norman W. Beale, Elijah Jaynes, and Oliver M. Bryant his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty five thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law.

The Procurers in Plaintiff No 31 this day obtained their report which is ordered to be recorded.

Edwin Bradshaw who has been elected Constable in District No 1 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1858 together with Joseph P. Bradshaw, Jacob Giffen, M. D. Butter, & Watkins W. Stephenson his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand dollars conditioned according to law.
