On the motion of Patsy Brown the Consent of the Court is granted her to bind her infant son age ten years the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1857 to Perry Saunders, the said Perry Saunders paying to the mother one hundred and fifty Dollars for the services of the apprentice, and to pay her annually a proportional part of the same.

For reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that an order of the Court of this County bind David Holliman, free negro, to Robert M. Dales. The said Robert M. Dales to pay to the apprentice the sum of one hundred and twenty five dollars for his services in the art trade or business in which he is to be taught when he arrives to the age of twenty one years and the overseer of the poor by whom this order shall be executed shall take from the master bond in a penalty of at least double the amount to be paid to the apprentice conditioned according to Law.

On the motion of Harry Cook to open a new road from Brykinn's Bridge road near Crosscut Run to Brown's bridge road near Margaret Bonnetts. The Court taking into consideration the reports of the Commissioners appointed to view the way proposed for opening said road made at the last term of this Court doth refuse to have the said road opened as proposed & that this application be dismissed.

For reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that an order of the Court of this County bind Sandy Holliman aged 17 years to Shugars Lamb. The said Shugars Lamb to pay forty dollars per annum for the services of the apprentice until he arrives to the age of twenty one years to be reserved to the said apprentice when he arrives to the age of twenty one years and the overseer of the poor by whom this order shall be executed shall take from the master bond in a penalty of at least double the amount to be paid the apprentice conditioned according to Law.

Orders that the Clerk register Newton Curtis, free negro, who was born free in this County as appears by the testimony of Mills S. Guy.

The last will and testament of Drury Bond dec'd was this day proved by the oaths of W<sup>m</sup> R. Stephenson and John W. Judkins, two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and was thereupon ordered to be recorded.
