

- Concerning Land, was admitted to record, February 28th 1859.
- Deed of Trust dated 13th January 1859, between Thomas Chittys of the first part, John Brabant of the second part and George E. Kope of the third part, Concerning personal property - was admitted to record, February 28th 1859.
- Deed of Benjamin and Sale dated 5th February 1859 from Sally Joyner to Milton D. Butler - Concerning Land. was admitted to record, March 2nd 1859.
- Deed of Trust dated 5th March 1859, from Edwin Bradshaw to Franklin Wick. Concerning real and personal property to secure Milton D. Butler, was admitted to record, March 9th 1859.
- Deed of Trust dated 8th March 1859, from Joseph P. Slade to Joseph Gardner. Concerning personal property to secure William W. Stephenson, was admitted to record, March 14th 1859.

Ordered that the Sheriff summon all the acting Justices of this County to the next term of this Court to take into consideration the propriety of allowing the merchants in this County to sell by retail Ardent Spirits or a mixture thereof at their respective stores.

On the motion of James C. Schell executor of William J. Schell dec^d. It is ordered that the Account of his transactions as executor aforesaid and returned to this Court be recommended to a committee of this Court for a resettlement of the same.

An Inquisition taken at an old Will near Bancroft's meeting house on the 28th day of Feb^ry 1859, before Thomas Laint a Justice of the peace of said County upon the body of a white child unknown there lying dead - was this day returned and ordered to be filed.

The last Will and Testament of Allen D. Bull dec^d was proved by the oaths of Benjamin D. Bancroft and Geo. H. Darden, the subscribing witnesses thereto and was ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of James J. Darden, the executor therein named who made oath and together with Richard J. Darden and Davis Bancroft his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of ten thousand Dollars, conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

Ordered that Parker D. Stuy, Mary Stuy, Benjamin Duffin, and George D. Butler or any three of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels & real estate of Allen D. Bull dec^d that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

On the motion of Isaac Cox who made oath and together with Joshua Bitters & Benjamin Darden his securities (who justified on oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of fifty dollars conditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of Administration on the estate of Franklin Robinson dec^d in due form.

William W. Stephenson is appointed Surveyor of the road from Vicksburg to Graysboro place in the town of P. H. Rollins dec^d and it is ordered that the usual funds do work thereon.
