On consideration whereof, the Court approving and confirming the said reports both as to facts and law and deems that the sum be paid from and stable and finding between the parties for ever, and that the costs of these causes be proportionably borne by the parties.

Parker, of John Moore's guardianship of Susan Howell, of Allen H. Hutton's executorial proceedings in the estate of Grace Holland, of Daniel Lobb's guardianship of William Allman, John Allman, Robert Allman, and Martha Allman, and Nathan N. Thomas' guardianship of Nathaniel A. Jones having severally lain over month and upwards in the Clerk's Office and there being no exceptions thereto, were severally examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded.

The Account of Samuel Kello, late Sheriff's administration in the estate of John Kitchin, the account of the Debts & Demands against the said John Kitchin in his estate and the account appertaining the amount in the hands of the said Samuel Kello late Sheriff's administrator of the said John Kitchin amongst the several creditors who have proved their debts according to law, having lain one month and upwards in the Clerk's Office and there being no exceptions thereto, were examined, confirmed and ordered to be recorded. And the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that Samuel Kello, late Sheriff, & administrator of the said John Kitchin out the amount in his hands as administrator pay to himself the sum of \$38.49 & 70¢ to Richard J. Darden \$3.24 & 4¢ Wm. Wells Kitchin's estate \$11.82, J. B. Vick \$2.92 & 4¢ \$2.35 & 4¢ E. M. Williams \$1.4, R. H. Blythe 28¢, and James S.
