

and the Court having heard the evidence are of opinion that a felony has been committed and that there is probable cause to charge the accused therewith and doth order him for trial in the Circuit Court of this County. On the motion of James Blythe the Court being of opinion that he is entitled to bail, doth order that the said James Blythe be allowed to enter into recognizance in the penalty of \$500.00 with sufficient surety in the like sum of \$500.00 for his appearance before the said Circuit Court on the first day of the next term of the said Court to stand his trial for the offence aforesaid with which he stands charged. And the said James Blythe is remanded to jail.

The Court certifies that two notes executed by N. S. Hook & S. J. Briggs to John Raykin one for \$139, 7/100 Dollars dated February 15th 1855 and due 25th February 1855, the other for \$17, 4/100 Dollars dated 12th February 1855 and due 25th December 1855 are included in the inventory and appraisement of the estate of the said John Raykin returned to this Court. That the said two notes were placed by the said John Raykin in his lifetime in the hands of Jas. Lashley Constable of Jackson County, Tennessee for collection and the receipt of the said Jas. Lashley has been placed in the hands of Geo. W. Wigham Esq. which is ordered to be certified.

On the motion of Richard O. Whithead, Gentleman, who has been licensed to practice law in the Courts of this Commonwealth he is permitted to qualify in this Court and thereupon he took the several oaths prescribed by Law.

Ordered that Wmth Summerville and James G. Jones two of the Commissioners of roads of this County let to the lowest bidder the repairs of Light wood bridge and receive thereon when completed and make report to Court.

#⁰ Thomas Westbrook is appointed Surveyor of the road from the Sussex County line to Westbrook's Mill in the room of Wmth R. Westbrook removed from the County, and it is ordered that the usual hands do work thereon.

On the motion of Mordock Clayton guardian of John A. J. K. & R. A. Clayton he is allowed to expend the sum of fifteen dollars of the principal of his said wards' estate for their support &c.

On the motion of Ivin Griffin guardian of James, John & Elizabeth Wmell he is allowed to expend the sum of fifty dollars of the principal of his said wards' estate for their support &c. for the year 1859.

On the motion of Robert Camell, Robert Whithead, Goodwyn Turner, Ben Johnson & Archer Vick and for reasons appearing to the Court the rule made against them at the last term of this Court for failing to attend as witnesses on behalf of the Commonwealth against James Wallace and James Blythe is discharged.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow morning Ten o'clock.
