On the motion of the defendants by their attorney who pleaded non assumpsit
to which the plaintiff by her attorney replied generally the judgment obtained
against them in the office is set aside and thereupon came a jury Empanelled
Wm. P. Harris, E. C. Mayet, Milton Jones, John E. Briggs, F. T. Ridley,
Lionel Stephenson, Jno. Chappell, Goodman E. Johnson, Godwin Parker,
Thomas H. Briggs, Orvis Moore, and Geo. W. Spring, who being selected
by lot, tried and sworn the trial to speak upon the issue joined upon their oath
returned a verdict in the following words and figures, Empanelled: We the jury find for
the plaintiff and assess her damages at one hundred & twenty dollars & interest
from the 1st day of January 1857. Therefore it is considered by the Court that the
plaintiff recover against the defendants one hundred & twenty dollars with
legal interest thereon from the 1st day of January 1857, till payment, and
her costs by her about this suit in this behalf expended. And the said
defendants in mercy ye.

Whereupon the Defendants by their attorney moved the Court to set aside the verdict
and judgment rendered in the above cause and to grant them a new trial therein
which being overruled, the Defendants tendered their bill of exceptions to the
opinions of the Court overruling the said motion which was received, signed,
and sealed by the Court and ordered to be made part of the record in the said
cause.

The reasons appearing to the Court it is ordered that an Overseer of the Poor of this
County do bind Diana aged 8 years & Ellick aged three years infant daughters
& children of Lucy Hicks dec'd to Dismas & Doles. The said Doles
paying for the services of Diana to her when she arrives to thence of
eighteen years the sum of Ten Dollars and for the services of Ellick
to him when he arrives to the age of twenty one years ^{the sum of ten dollars} for the payment
of which sums bond shall be taken by the Overseer binding said
Minors.

The Court doth allow Wm. P. Harris, E. C. Mayet, Milton Jones, John E.
Briggs, F. T. Ridley, Lionel Stephenson, Jno. Chappell, Goodman E. Johnson,
Godwin Parker, Thomas H. Briggs, Orvis Moore and Geo. W. Spring
each fifty cents for their services as Jurors in the trial of Prosecutions
and misdemeanors, to be paid out of the public Treasury.
