Harris refusing to give the said new bond it is ordered that his powers as guardian aforesaid be annulled and revoked and that he pay the costs of this motion. And the Court doth assign Julius C. Harris as guardian of Fabian L., Sarah, Martha, Theoponi, Ellen, Rosal & Millard F. Harris orphans of Samuel Harris dec'd. Whereupon he together with John S. Powell & J. F. Harris, his sureties, (who justified out o'it as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledges alone in the penalty of ten thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law -

Beach as Constable collected and received and failed to account for, together with fifteen per centum per annum damages on said amounts from the 15th day of March 1849, full paid, and his costs by him about his motion in this behalf expended.
