 Samuel R. Kells, Justices.

 -and conveying Land & personal property was admitted to record, May 18th 1859.

✓ Deed of Bargain and Sale dated 7th May 1859, from Elijah W. Hudson to Jacob D. Barnes was ad-
 mitted to record, May 19th 1859.

✓ Deed of Bargain and Sale dated 13th May 1859, from Zachariah Cobb to Benjamin Cobb conveying
 Land, was admitted to record May 26th 1859.

✓ Deed of Bargain and Sale dated May 25th 1859, from Oliver L. Long & Elijah J. Williams (f) & wife

 ordered that the usual bonds be taken.

✓ It is ordered that the Clerk register Henry Holland, ferryman, who was born free in this County
 as appears by the testimony of Goodman E. Johnson.

On the Application of Elijah J. Jarnes who produced the Sheriff's receipt for the Tax
 imposed by Law, a License is granted him to keep an ordinary at his respective
 house in this County until the next April term of this Court. It being the opinion
 of the Court that he is sober and of good character and will probably keep
 a house, orderly and useful and such as the Law requires. Although he
 is upon Court entered into bond in the penalty of two hundred Dollars
 with sufficient security conditioned according to Law, and took the oath
 prescribed by Law.
