

Indictment of the Grand Jury this day returned against him. which motion the Court ordered and required the said Jesse Johnson to enter into such recognizance, himself in the sum of two hundred Dollars with sufficient security in like sum. Whereupon the said Jesse Johnson together with Corbett & Hill and Wm. D. Shanks his securities, severally acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the following manner that is to say the said Jesse Johnson in the sum of two hundred Dollars and the said Corbett & Hill and Wm. D. Shanks his securities in the like sum of two hundred Dollars to be paid of their respective goods and chattels, lands and tenements and the use of the said Commonwealth's lands. Yet upon this condition that if the said Jesse Johnson shall personally appear on the first day of the next March term of this Court to answer the said indictment and shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then the above recognizance to be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the ~~fourth~~ morning ten o'clock.
