

Indictment of the Grand Jury this day present & against him which makes out  
the Court orders and require the said Jefse Johnson to enter into such  
recognition, himself in the sum of two hundred Dollars with sufficient security  
in like sum, Mr. Chapman the said Jefse Johnson together with Edward T. Hill  
and Wm. D. Shands his securities, severally acknowledge themselves to be indebted  
to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the following manner that is to say the  
said Jefse Johnson in the sum of two hundred Dollars and the said Edward  
T. Hill and Mr. D. Shands his securities in the like sum of two hundred Dollars  
to be paid of their respective goods and chattels lands and tenements and the  
use of the said Commonwealth at pleasure. Yet upon this condition that if the  
said Jefse Johnson shall personally appear on the first day of the  
next March term of this Court to answer the said Indictment and  
shall not depart thence without the leave of the said Court, then  
the above recognition to be null and void, otherwise to remain in full  
face (one value)

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the following morning) Ben Clark.
