

The last Will and Testament of George Williams dec'd. was again proved by the oath of John S. Reale, another subscribing witness thereto (and the same having been proved on the 15th day of August 1857, by the oath of J. J. Wordard, as subscribing witness thereto was ordered to be recorded. Benjamin C. Pope, the executor therein named appeared in Court and refused to take upon himself the burden of the execution thereof. It is ordered that Wm. W. Buzz, Sheriff of this County take into his hands the estate of the said George Williams dec'd. to be administered according to law.

Ordered that James W. Correll, Mills W. Correll, William W. Correll, Mills Pope & Wm. B. Pope, or any three of them, being sworn for the purpose, do appraise all the goods or chattels of George Williams dec'd. that may be produced to them & make due return of the same.

On the Application of Henry Cook to open a new road from Baylin's Bridge road near Baylin's Depot to Brown's bridge road near Masons Mills, The Commissioners directed to view the ground proposed for opening said road. This day made their report and the Court taking the same into consideration doth adopt the road as reported to be opened by the said Henry Cook to be a public highway of this County and appoint Henry Cook the Surveyor of the same and it is ordered that Richard B. Ferguson, William J. Jones & Lewis Vick, Surveyors of roads of this County be summoned here to the next term of this Court to show cause if any they can why some of the lands on their roads should not be transferred to the road of the said Henry Cook Surveyor.

John C. Briggs, Wm. M. Parker, S. H. Bishop, Elijah J. Jones, W. W. Briggs, Wm. C. Gay, William Atkinson, E. C. Mager, August Sam, Alfred S. Stephenson, Geo. W. Cloud & Julian I. Brumby are appointed School Commissioners for this County for the year next ensuing commencing on the first day of January 1860, and the Sheriff is ordered to notify them of their appointment.
