

Ordered that the amount of \$2000.00 have paid of this Court amounting to unpaid
 Dollars for each year for the maintenance and care of John Parker a female convict in
 jail committed to the custody of public funds to be collected and paid, the said
 James having paid to the Court that immediately after the commitment of the
 said female applicant was made to the keeper of both a diploma for admission
 and that such application was refused for want of room.

The Court will allow L. R. Edwards Clerk of this Court Twenty five Dollars
 for examining and certifying the books of the Commissioners of the Revenue of this
 County to the Auditor which allowance is added to be collected to the Auditor
 & David Edwards for his remuneration and payment.

The last will and testament of Lucy Parker dec'd was this day wholly proved
 by the oath of Wm. C. Paine, another subscribing witness thereto, and was
 ordered to be recorded by Robert M. and William M. Parker, two of the executors
 therein named appeared in Court and refused to taken from themselves any part
 of the portion of the execution thereof; on the motion of James T. Parker the three
 executors therein named who made oath together with Robert M. Parker and
 William M. Parker his securities (who justified in each as to their sufficiency)
 entered into and acknowledged about in the penalty of Ten thousand Dollars con-
 ditioned according to Law, Certificate is granted the said James T. Parker for
 obtaining a probate of the said will in due form.

Ordered that Jos. E. Paine, John Williams, Robt. Newland, Fortunatus Duim and
 Wm. Paine in any three of them being sworn for the purpose, do appraise
 all the goods & chattels of Lucy Parker dec'd. that may be produced to
 them & make due return of the same.
