On the motion of Wm. S. Morr. and for reasons appearing to the Court, the rule made against him at the last quarterly term of this Court for failing to attend as a witness for the Commonwealth against P. C. Cobb is discharged.

Mary V. Dyckin and Hannah A. Dyckin orphans of John Dyckin dec'd having in writing nominated Wm. H. Sumner and J. and W. Kells as their guardians the Court took a petition from them and the Court took appointment Wm. H. Sumner and J. and W. Kells as guardians of Richard V. Dyckin orphan of the said John Dyckin dec'd. Whereupon they together with Allen Edwards, Thomas J. Dutton, Joshua Dutton, J. S. Dutton, A. S. H. Dutton and John V. Dyckin their stewards (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law.

The Codicil to the last Will and testament of Charles V. Kells dec'd. was this Day fully proved by the oath of Wm. S. Morr. also a subscribing witness thereto and the said testimony being fully proved and the said Codicil having been proved by the oath of C. S. H. Dutton the other subscribing witness thereto, the said Codicil and original are ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till the first Day of the next term.
