Gardner, Richard M. Stephenson and James Bister each one dollar for their services on this day as jurors in prosecutions for misdemeanors to be paid out of the public treasure.

James Holland, Jacob Leno and Joshua Vick who were summoned to appear here on this day as jurors in the trial of civil causes were solemnly called, but came not, whereupon, it is ordered that they be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next quarterly term of this Court designated for the trial of civil causes, to shew cause, if any they can, why they should not be fined for their said contempt.
