This day Edwin M. Williams appeared in Court in obedience to the summons
issued in this cause and on oath acknowledges himself indebted to the said
Defendant in the sum of \$24.56. Therefore it is ordered that the said
Edwin M. Williams pay to Wm. R. Briggs Sheriff of this County
the said amount of \$24.56 & that the said Sheriff apply the
same first to the payment of the costs of this suggestion, then to
the payment of an execution sued out of the Clerk's office of South-
ampton County Court on the 30th day of March 1860 against the
said Defendant for \$30.69 & with legal interest thereon from the
8th day of November 1859 & 81 cents costs subject to a credit
of \$10.00 paid 31st November 1859 and the balance if any pay
over to the Defendant.

The last will and testament of John H. Smith dec'd was this day proved
by the oaths of Jas. J. Andrews and John L. Thorp the subscribing witnesses
thereof and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Theophilus
G. Bachman (no executor being named in the will) who made oath (and
deposited with James E. Petrus & L. W. Mason, his Securies, (who justified
on oath as to their sufficiency) intended and acknowledged a bond with
penalty of twenty thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law, that
he is granted him for obtaining letters of administration with
the will of the said John H. Smith dec'd annexed in due form.

Ordered that O. C. Ingers, Robt. J. Fitch, Wm. B. Saunders, John L.
Thorpe and Francis J. Widley or any three of them being sworn
for the purpose do appraise all the goods & chattels of John
H. Smith dec'd that may be produced to them (and make due
return of the same.

The Consent of the Court is granted Martha Johnson free negro to bind
her son Washington to H. B. Wigham until he is twenty one years
of age. The Master paying for the services of the apprentice to
the mother eight hundred Dollars for the term for which he is to be bound
(and at the expiration of the term that he pay to the apprentice
four hundred Dollars.
