

Ordered that Joseph C. Blanton be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term to show cause, if any, he can why some of the horses on his road should not be transferred to the road over which Wm D. Baymond is Surveyor.

Upon satisfactory testimony produced before the Court, the Court doth certify that Wm. Braham entitled to land amounting to 52.083, containing 80 acres which was issued on the 29th day of July 1853, departed this life on the 16th day of January 1853, leaving no widow but the following children & grand children as his heirs at law, to wit; Quilburt D. Braham, Saml. H. Braham, and Willis F. Braham, children, and Theophilus G. Braham, Paul G. Braham, and Georgiana Witt, grandchildren and the Court doth further certify that the last will and testament of Samuel Braham was duly admitted to probate in this Court on the 31st day of February 1853, and that letters testamentary were granted to C. D. Braham who was considered executor in the last will and testament of Saml. Braham dec'd. which will more fully appear by reference to the will annexed to this certificate.

The Court doth nominally appoint Allen Edwards, guardian of Junius W. Octavius F. and Jesse A. Edwards orphans of Robert G. Edwards dec'd. Whereupon he appeared with Thomas J. Bishop & Willis Brads haw, his sureties (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Four thousand Dollars conditioned according to law.

Mary L. Smith orphan of Samuel Smith dec'd. having associated Benjamin C. Spiller for her guardian, the Court doth appoint him. Whereupon he together with William W. Cobb his sureties (who justified in oath as to their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of one hundred Dollars conditioned according to law.

On the motion of James H. Mangum guardian of Edward M. Wrenn and Andrew J. Wrenn he is allowed to expend the sum of \$301.35 of the principal of Edward M. Wrenn and \$256.59 of the principal of Andrew J. Wrenn's estates for their support &c. for the year 1857.

On the motion of Wm. H. Summrell guardian of Peter Ward he is allowed to expend the sum of \$35.38 of the principal of his ward's estate for her support &c.

Edwin R. Strong has been elected Sheriff in District No. 3 in this County for the term of two years commencing on the first day of July 1860. Together with Ben C. Pope & Patrick D. Strong his sureties, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, and thereupon took the several oaths prescribed by law.
