On the motion of John T. Powell who is bound in this Court as the security of Julius C. Harris as the guardian of Tabitha L. Sarah, Martha, Milson, Ella, Rosa, & William E. Harris orphans of Howell Harris dec'd. It is ordered that the said Julius C. Harris be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term of this Court to show cause if any he can why he should not be required to give a new bond as guardian aforesaid or have his powers revoked.

Ordered that Mills Pope Committee of Mary Reese lunatic be allowed to appropriate out of the principal after estate whatever sum may appear to be due him by his wards as her said Committee - But he is not authorized to sell any of her negro slaves.

James M. Bell who has been elected Commissioner of the Revenue for Northway District No 4 in the County of Southampton for the term of two years commencing on the first day of February 1861, together with Joshua Brettow & Robt. C. Paines his securities entered into and acknowledge aloud in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, and thereupon took the several oaths prescribed by law. which bond is ordered to be recorded.

A. W. A. Brettow and Joshua Brettow, Justices elected & commissioned in District No 4 in the County for four years commencing the first day of August 1860, Thomas J. B. B. Kells, in District No 6 and John D. B. B. Kells and Joshua Brettow in District No 7. This day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the several oaths prescribed by law.

On the motion of James M. Mangum who made oath and together with James C. Jones & Robt. M. McCune his securities, (who justified on oath as their sufficiency) entered into and acknowledge aloud in the penalty of fifteen hundred Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate William Matting dec'd. in due form.

Ordered that Jas. C. Jones, Jeremiah Dunn, W. J. F. Clements and Robt. Howland or any three of them being sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of William Matting dec'd. that
