On the motion of John T. Powell who is bound in this Court as the security of James C. Harris as the guardian of Fabian L. Sarah, Martha Wilson, Ella, Rosal, & Millard G. Harris orphans of Howell Harris dec'd. It is ordered that the said James C. Harris be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term of this Court to show cause if any he can why he shalld not be requireed to give a new bond as guardian aforesaid or have his powers revoked.

Ordered that Miss Jose Comitti of Mary Reese lunatic be allowed to appropriate out of the principal of her estate whatever sum may appear to be due her by her account as her said Committee - But he is not authoris'd to sell any of her negro slaves.

James A. Bell who has been electe's Commissioner of the Revenue for Notchway Parish in the County of Southwicks for the term of two years commencing on the first day of February 1861, together with Joshua Dritton & Robt. S. Barnes his securities instead into (and he acknowledged abond in the penalty of five thousand Dollars conditioned according to law, and thereupon took) the several oaths prescribed by Law. Which bond is ordain'd to be record'd.

A. W. Naffett and Joshua Dritton, Justices electe's & commisioned in District No 4 in this County for four years commencing the first day of August 1860. Thomas J. Brister, J. S. B. Kelle, in District No 6 and John D. Beylett and Joshua Dritton in District No 7. This day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the several oaths prescribed by law.

On the motion of James H. Mangum who mad. oath and together with James C. Stevens & Robt. M. Culver his securities, (who justify'd their oaths as their sufficiency) entered into (and acknowledge'd a bond in the penalty of fifteen hundred Dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of William Mallory dec'd. in due form).

Ordered that Jas. E. Peters, Nathaniel Dunn, W. G. Clements and Robt. Newland or any three of them being seven for the purpose do appraise all the goods or chattels of William Mallory dec'd. that
